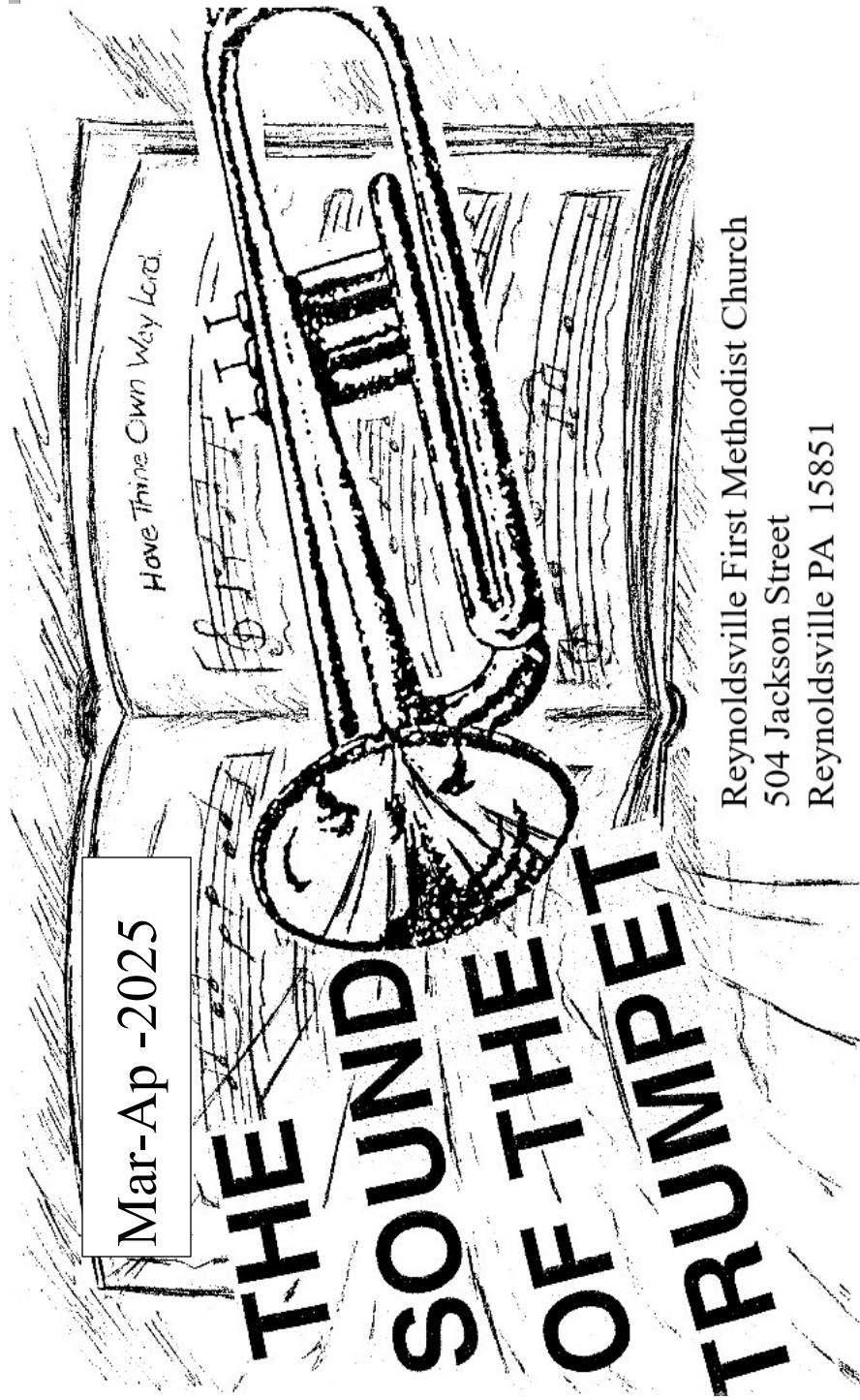

FROM THE PASTORS DESK

Matthew 4:1-11 “Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. ² After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. ³ The tempter came to him and said, ‘If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread. ⁴ Jesus answered, ‘It is written: Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.’

⁵ Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. ⁶ ‘If you are the Son of God,’ he said, ‘throw yourself down. For it is written: ‘He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.’ ⁷ Jesus answered him, ‘It is also written: Do not put the Lord your God to the test.’

⁸ Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. ⁹ ‘All this I will give you,’ he said, ‘if you will bow down and worship me.’ ¹⁰ Jesus said to him, ‘Away from me, Satan! For it is written: Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.’ ¹¹ Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.”

One of the most important times of the year occurs during the 40 days leading up to Easter – a season called LENT. Lent is influenced by the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness prior to beginning His ministry. It’s interesting, Matthew tells us immediately after John baptized Jesus in the Jordan River, Jesus was “led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.”

It was during this time of testing and fasting that Jesus’ identity was called into question by the devil himself. But when Jesus emerged from His spiritual wilderness – He began to teach and make disciples.

For us, Lent is more than giving up chocolate; it’s a time of sober reflection on the sacrifice of Jesus; a time when we internalize Jesus’ life and death by practicing self-denial and self-reflection.

When we think about Lent, we may feel dread because during this season we hear words like “denial, fasting, sacrifice, and temptation” but what if this Lent was different? What if we looked at Lent through the lens of grace, and in particular God’s grace? This year,

let's imagine all of the graces that will be offered to us; let's imagine that God is going to transform our lives with greater freedom, greater joy, and deeper desires for love and service.

If we imagine Lent as a time of dread in some way, then we have already predisposed ourselves to not getting much out of it. During Lent we can imagine that something wonderful is about to happen. Imagine what God wants to give us this Lent. Truth is, there is really something exciting coming that we can look forward to.

Let's not get too focused on ourselves and what we are going to do or not do (give up chocolate) that we miss God's gift. Lent is about God's great desire to bless us. And with the mindset of looking at Lent as God's grace and a gift He has for us, we can imagine that what we really want to do is to place ourselves in a space to receive what God wants to give us.

This year's Lent can be different. It will take an openness to God's grace and a deep desire to receive what is being offered to us by God. If we do this, God's desire for our hearts and our desire for greater connection with God will meet. Lent will no longer feel dreadful, but rather a blessing.

Prayer for Lent: *Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of this season. Thank you for knowing our hearts and drawing us into a deeper communion with you throughout the coming 40 days.*

Lord, it can be disheartening to read on Ash Wednesday that all come from dust, and to dust all return (Ecclesiastes 3:20), yet we know that there is more to our stories. We know that you created man and woman from the dust at the very beginning of time (Genesis 2:7) and that you breathed life into them to transform them into living creatures. We know that you are in the business of resurrection-- your very Son went to the cross to show us that no death is final and that ultimate transformation comes through your gift of salvation. Though we were made from dust, and our bodies will return to dust again, we can live in eternal glory with you through the blood of your Son.
